NEIGHBORHOOD SCAVENGER HUNT

Scavenger Stop: The Gathering Circle

Find the stone circle in the park, it honors a great leader and welcomes all to pause, reflect, and share.

Fun Fact: This The rising sun in its design represents the Spokane Tribe “Children of the Sun.”

Activity: Stand in the center, spin slowly, and imagine you’re telling a story around a campfire, just like people did long ago. What story would you share?

Scavenger Stop: Chief Garry Gateway & Plaque

At the entrance to this neighborhood, find a sign and plaque that tell the story of a leader and the river that shaped his community.

Fun Fact: Chief Garry was a respected leader who studied far from home and returned to teach and guide his people with wisdom and care.

Activity: Imagine you could ask Chief Garry one question. What would you want to know about his life or his dreams for his community?

Scavenger Stop: The Iron Bridge

Find the tall steel structure stretching across the river.

Fun Fact: The Iron Bridge was built in 1911 to carry trains across the Spokane River as part of the Oregon-Washington Railroad & Navigation Company.

Activity: Walk across and count how many birds, boats, or critters you can spot along the river. What sounds might have filled the air here 100 years ago?

Scavenger Stop: SCC Labyrinth

Find the winding path on campus where quiet footsteps lead to calm and focus—it’s not just a walk, it’s a puzzle!

Fun Fact: Labyrinths have been used for thousands of years to help people slow down, reflect, and find peace.

Activity: Walk the path slowly and count your steps to the center, how does it make you feel when you get there?

Scavenger Stop: Felts Field – Spokane’s First Airport

Wings once roared here as pioneers of flight took to the sky—this historic airfield helped Spokane’s aviation story take off!

Fun Fact: Famous aviator Charles Lindbergh landed here in 1927, just months after his historic transatlantic flight.

Activity: Pretend you’re a pilot—spread your arms like wings and “fly” across the grass! What kind of plane would you fly?

Scavenger Stop: Greene Street Bridge

Where Greene Street meets the Spokane River, this 1950s bridge connects neighborhoods and offers sweeping river views.

Fun Fact: Built over 70 years ago, the bridge is still a key crossing for cars, bikes, and walkers in Spokane today.

Activity: Pause at the center of the bridge—can you spot birds, boats, or anything floating in the river below?

Play "School Explorer"! Pretend you're on your first day—can you find the front door, a place to sit, and the tallest slide?

Bonus Stop: Your Local Business & Community Center!

Explore your neighborhood! Stop by a local business (like a bakery, barber shop, or market) and visit your community center to see what events or resources they offer for families. These places are great for making connections and learning more about your area!

The Jundt Art Museum at Gonzaga University Free and open to the public, the Jundt Art Museum collects, conserves, exhibits, and interprets original works of art. Come explore a diverse range of exhibitions and permanent collections in educational space.

Mini Activity:

Draw a "Neighborhood Treasure Map" with your child—mark the business, the community center, and one fun thing you saw at each place!
