NEIGHBORHOOD SCAVENGER HUNT

Scavenger Stop: A&T Brake Mural – A Community Masterpiece Look for the wall where community and color came together, just past the coffee and the car parts.

Fun Fact: Local business owner Jack Miller teamed up with Whitworth art students and the neighborhood to create a mural voted on by the community. From sketches to paint, this artwork shows the power of people coming together!

Activity— "Design Your Dream Wall" What would you put on a mural to represent your neighborhood? Sketch your idea or describe it with colors, shapes, and meaning!

Scavenger Stop: Wild Horse Park – Hidden Nature Haven Where wild horses once roamed, and cattails now sway find the new playground where laughter leads the way!

Fun Fact: Wild Horse Park is a peaceful place full of nature, with shady trees, chirping birds, and even a brand-new playground that opened in 2023! It has a treehouse, saucer swing, rope climbers, and connects to the Children of the Sun Trail.

Activity – "Wildlife Watchers" Pick a quiet spot, sit for one minute, and count how many animals, birds, or bugs you can spot or hear. Can you find something with wings?

Scavenger Stop: Beacon Hill – Stories in the Sky Look up high to where the hill meets the sky—this place has seen both sacred gatherings and soaring planes!

Fun Fact: Beacon Hill has a deep and layered history. For generations, it was an important gathering place for local Indigenous people known as Miikwin. Years later, it became a hub for early aviation in Spokane—earning its name as a "beacon" in the sky. Today, it's a place to hike, bike, and imagine all the footsteps and flight paths that came before.

Activity – "Then & Now" Time Travel Game! Pretend you're a time traveler! What would you wear, carry, or see if you visited Beacon Hill 200 years ago? How about 100 years ago? Act it out or share your ideas with a friend!

Scavenger Stop: Children of the Sun Trail – A Path with Purpose Follow the trail that shares its name with the Spokane people—where wheels spin and stories flow beside the freeway.

Fun Fact:

The Children of the Sun Trail is a shared-use path named after the Spokane Tribe's meaning: "Children of the Sun." It honors the cultural and historical significance of the land, shaped with the guidance of local Indigenous voices and community input.

Activity – "Trail Trekker Challenge" Walk or ride a section of the trail and try to spot three things from nature and three things humans built (like bridges. signs, or buildings). Can you find where nature and people work together?

Scavenger Stop: Hillyard Heritage Museum – Train Time Travel Where do old trains sleep and stories roll on wheels? Find the red caboose and look inside!

Fun Fact: The Hillyard Heritage Museum has real vintage train cars you can explore! Inside, you'll see old tools, photos, and treasures from Spokane's railroad days.

Activity - "Conductor Challenge" Pretend you're the train conductor! Where would your train go? Make up a name for your train and shout, "All aboard!" to your group!

Scavenger Stop: Regal Rock Snake – A Growing Neighborhood Friend: Slither down Regal before Columbia's bend—find a rock snake with colors that never end!

Fun Fact: This cheerful rock snake was started by a 6-year-old neighbor with one simple goal: bring people together. It's now a growing symbol of community creativity!

Activity – "Add Your Rock!" Admire the painted stones, then decorate your own rock at home or on-site. Add it to the line and help the snake grow all summer long. Let's see how long it can get!
