

Scavenger Hunt Stop: Japanese Garden I'm quiet and calm with a pond full of fish, Find me for peace or a photo-wish. Bridges, rocks, and trees so neat!

Fun Fact: This peac eful garden is named after Spokane's sister city in Japan—Nishinomiya! A long time ago, it was a zoo with animals like ostriches and emus!

Activity: Walk around the pond and count how many colorful koi fish you can find. Hint: Look closely—some like to hide under the rocks or plants!

Scavenger Stop: Gaiser Conservatory – A World of Plants Step inside the glassy dome where plants from every climate call home—just past Duncan Gardens, you'll find the bloom!

Fun Fact: The Gaiser Conservatory, named after longtime park board member Dr. David Gaiser, is a greenhouse filled with plants from around the world. It's free to visit year-round and shows off seasonal displays thanks to the Friends of Manito, a group that helps keep the park blooming.

Activity – "Plant Passport" Pretend you're exploring the jungle or desert can you find a plant with big leaves? One with spikes? One that smells good? Draw your favorite!

Scavenger Stop: The Scoop – Seriously Fun Flavors Find the spot where cones are king and flavors rotate with the swing award-winning scoops await with something for every taste!

Fun Fact: The Scoop is known for its small-batch, handcrafted ice cream and fresh waffle cones. Every day, they dream up new flavors—like Watermelon Dole, Mud Pie, and Coco Nutty Trail Mix. With vegan, dairy-free, and glutenfree options, there's something fun for everyone!

Activity – "Design Your Dream Flavor!" Draw your very own ice cream creation. What's it called? What's in it? Would it be fruity, chocolatey, crunchy, or creamy? Share it with your grown-up or even show it to the Scoop crew!

Congratulations, explorers! Scavenger Hunt Stop: The Duck Pond (Mirror Pond) Once called Mirror, shallow and wide, Skaters and dancers came to glide. With ducks today and fish below— Can you guess where families go?

Fun Fact: Long ago, this pond was big enough for boats, dances, and winter ice skating! It was only about 2–5 feet deep and people even rented canoes here. Activity: Stand by the edge and count how many ducks you see.

Bonus: Talk about what it might have been like to skate here 100 years ago!

Scavenger Hunt Stop: Rose & Lilac Gardens I'm full of petals, colors so bright, I bloom in the day and sleep at night.With 150 roses and lilacs too. What garden smells sweet and shows every hue?

Fun Fact: This garden has over 150 kinds of roses and 100 kinds of lilacs— Spokane is even called The Lilac City! Some of these flowers have been blooming here for over 100 years!

Activity: Close your eyes and take a big sniff—what does the garden smell like to you?

Scavenger Stop: Park Bench Café – Snacks in the Shade

Where the gardens bloom and the music might play, find a bench, grab a snack, and enjoy the day!

Fun Fact: Since 1923, the Park Bench Café has been a favorite local hangout. Whether it's a sunny day snack, a shady picnic, or a surprise concert, this café is a cozy corner of Manito Park where memories are made.

Activity – "Snack & Sketch"

Pick your favorite snack, then find a quiet picnic table. While you munch, sketch what you see around you—flowers, trees, birds, or friends!

Bonus Stop: Your Local Library!

While you're out exploring, don't forget to swing by your local library Join in on their storytimes and check out tons of fun, free rentals to keep your summer full of learning and play. From books and games to activity kits and more, it's a perfect way to keep the adventure going!

Bonus Stop: Your Local Aquatic Center!
