Neighborhood Scavenger Hunt

Scavenger Stop: Spark Central — Creativity for All Step inside where cozy fall days meet bright ideas this space sparks stories, art, and adventures for everyone.

Fun Fact: Spark Central is a nonprofit that makes creativity and technology accessible to all. From storytelling to robotics, it's a hub where curiosity fuels learning and imagination shines.

Activity - "Idea Spark!"

Write or draw a story idea on a sticky note to add to the "Idea Wall," or invent a superhero with powers sparked by imagination!

Scavenger Stop: Love Letter to Spokane A City on the Wall Stroll near the Welcome Center hall, where Spokane's story is painted tall.

Fun Fact: This mural, painted by Cain and Todd Benson in 2012, is called Love Letter to Spokane. It's like a giant postcard, filled with scenes and symbols that celebrate the city.

Activity — "I Spy Spokane!" Look closely at the mural. Can you spot a river, a bridge, and a building you've seen before? Then strike a pose like one of the mural's people and snap a fun photo!

Scavenger Stop: So It Flows — River in Steel Follow the Centennial Trail where the land opens wide, and see waves made of steel that seem to glide.

Fun Fact: So It Flows is a corten steel fence sculpture at the Halblin Overlook, designed to mimic the steady movement of the Spokane River.

Activity – "River in Motion!" Stand in front of the sculpture. Stretch your arms wide and gently wave them like a river current. Can you move as smoothly as flowing water? Count how many river-like curves you can spot in the sculpture!

Scavenger Stop: My Fresh Market Basket — Fresh and Local Step inside where autumn flavors fill the shelves and friendly smiles make you feel at home.

Fun Fact: My Fresh Market Basket is all about fresh, high-quality, locally sourced products with personalized service. It's like visiting your neighbor's pantry always welcoming and full of good things.

Activity – "Chef for a Day!"

Pick your favorite fall fruit or veggie and strike your best "chef pose" with it! Imagine (or describe) a recipe you'd create using that ingredient.

Scavenger Stop: Olmsted Brothers Green — A Place to Pause Tucked near the trail where leaves drift down, find the small green space in the heart our part of town.

Fun Fact: This park is named after the Olmsted Brothers, famous landscape architects who inspired Spokane's early park system. They believed every community should have beautiful green spaces for people to rest, play, and connect with nature.

Activity – "Leaf Explorer!" Look around the park and collect (or spot) three different kinds of fall leaves. Can you find one that's big, one that's small, and one with the brightest color?

Scavenger Stop: Bulldozer — Power in Stillness Near the Maple Street Bridge, find a steel giant standing strong and still.

Fun Fact: Bulldozer by Roger Berry is a corten steel sculpture that honors the quiet strength of the workers who helped build Spokane.

Activity – "Big Machine Fun!" Pretend you're driving a giant bulldozer! Stomp like the machine and make engine sounds. Then imagine designing your own sculpture to honor Spokane builders what would it look like?

Come pick your perfect pumpkin, enjoy fall activities, and support a great cause!

Bonus Stop: Main Market Community Dinners

Grab a yummy hot dinner for just five dollars at Main Market! This is a special spot where neighbors come together to share fresh, healthy food!!

Once the Farmers Market closes for the season, you can still visit the Scalehouse for farm-fresh fruits, veggies, meats, and dairy year-round it's an indoor farmers market with so much more!
