

Scavenger Hunt Stop: The Japanese Garden

Fun Fact: This garden honors Spokane's sister city, Nishinomiya. Long ago, it was once a zoo with ostriches and emus!

Activity: Stroll the pond and count the koi. Look closely some may hide under rocks or leaves. Open daily 10 a.m.—6 p.m., April through October. Closes for the season at the end of October.

Scavenger Stop: Gaiser Conservatory — A World of Plants

Fun Fact: The Conservatory is named for Dr. David Gaiser. It holds plants from around the world. Friends of Manito change the displays with the seasons.

Activity — "Plant Passport": Pretend you're wandering a jungle or a desert can you find a plant with big leaves? One with spikes? One that smells good? Draw your favorite! The Conservatory is open every day except Wednesday, from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., and is free year-round.

Scavenger Stop: The Scoop and The Hidden Bagel – Seriously Fun Fall
Flavors

Find the spot where cones and bagels reign, where flavors change with the season and every bite feels like autumn's gain.

Fun Fact: The Scoop serves handcrafted ice cream while the Hidden Bagel bakes up fresh bagels—together they make the perfect fall pair with seasonal flavors like pumpkin spice, caramel apple, and cinnamon swirl.

Activity - "Create Your Fall Flavor!"

Design your own autumn-inspired treat. What's it called? What's in it? Would it be pumpkiny, apple-spiced, nutty, or maple-sweet? Share your creation with your grown-up or even show it to the Scoop and Bagel crew!

Scavenger Hunt Stop: The Duck Pond (Mirror Pond)
Leaves drift down as ripples flow. Ducks gather round where
families go

Fun Fact: Over a hundred years ago this pond was big enough for boats, dances, and winter ice skating. People even rented canoes here.

Activity: Stand by the edge and count the ducks you see. can you imagine this lake all frozen over an ice skaters gliding across?

Scavenger Hunt Stop: Cannon Hill Park
Long ago this hill was full of clay
Where bricks were made in a bustling way
Now leaves drift down where workers once stood
Walk through the park and imagine the neighborhood

Fun Fact: Cannon Hill was once a brickyard. Clay found in the 1880s was turned into bricks used in downtown buildings and streets. After the clay ran out, the yard closed, leaving the park we enjoy today.

Activity: Look for the low spots and hills can you imagine where the clay was dug and bricks were shaped long ago?

Scavenger Stop: Upper Manito Playground
Crunchy leaves and swings that fly
Slides go fast as the breeze goes by

Fun Fact: A long time ago, this whole park was called
Montrose Park. Then the name changed to Manito, which
means "spirit of nature."

Activity: Count how many steps it takes to get from the swings to the slide. Can you do it again with tiny steps like a mouse?

Monster Dash at Manito Park - Sunday, October 26, 2025

Kids who register before October 15th can join the race for \$17 and receive a Monster Dash shirt. If you don't want to pay the fee, no worries – it's still a great place to watch the fun, cheer on runners, and meet your neighbors!

Bonus Tip! Once the Farmers Market closes for the season, you can still visit the Scalehouse for farm-fresh fruits, veggies, meats, and dairy year-round—it's like an indoor farmers market! They've created a beautiful community hub right by the bus stop, making it easy to get there via public transit.
