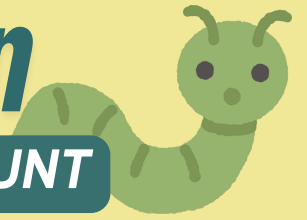




# Browne's Addition

## NEIGHBORHOOD SCAVENGER HUNT



**Scavenger Stop: Coeur d'Alene Park**  
Find the historic gazebo under the tall trees!

**Fun Fact:**  
Spokane's first public park, built in 1891! Today it's a favorite spot for picnics, play, and community gatherings.

**Activity:**  
Plan a spring party!  
Where's the music? How do you decorate? Act it out!

**Scavenger Stop: Overlook Park – Bridges & Big Views**  
Find the benches with sweeping valley views—don't forget your sweater!

**Fun Fact:**  
Perched 500 ft above the creek, Overlook Park was once an empty lot. Now it's a trailhead with golden fall views and cityscapes framed by leaves.

**Activity:**  
Fall Bridge Challenge! Count the bridges you see, try an echo across the valley, and explore the trail.

**Scavenger Stop: People's Park – Layers of History**  
Walk where rivers meet and fresh spring leaves flutter in the breeze.

**Fun Fact:**  
People's Park has been home to humans for over 8,000 years! Once a salmon fishing site for Indigenous peoples, it's still a place of culture and connection today.

**Activity: Spring River Challenge!** Listen to flowing water and birdsong. Imagine life here long ago and act out a riverside celebration!

**Scavenger Stop: Northwest Museum of Arts & Culture — Explore and Discover!** Spring sunlight brightens the museum's gardens as you step inside to explore art, history, and culture.

**Fun Fact:** The Northwest Museum of Arts & Culture (MAC) is Spokane's premier museum, showcasing Native American history, regional art, and fascinating cultural exhibits. It's a place where stories of the past come alive! You can also find discounted tickets on their website.

**Activity – Museum Treasure Hunt:**  
Find one piece of art that makes you smile    Spot an artifact that tells a story about the people of the region    Bonus: Ask a staff member for a fun fact and write it down!

**Scavenger Stop: Coeur d'Alene Farmers Market**

**Fun Fact:** Farmers markets aren't just for grown-ups! At Coeur d'Alene Park, families can explore fresh spring produce, flowers, and treats grown by local farmers. It's like a giant outdoor treasure hunt! The market opens again this spring.

**Activity:**  
"Spring Harvest Color Hunt!"  
Can you find a fruit, veggie, or flower in each color?  
Red – Green – Yellow – Pink – Purple  
Bonus: Ask a farmer what their favorite spring crop is and why!

**Scavenger Stop: Redband Park**  
Can you spot signs about protecting fish and wildlife?

**Fun Fact:**  
Once home to Glover Field, the park is now named for the Redband Rainbow Trout, a bright fish important to the Spokane Tribe and the river's health.

**Activity:**  
Trout Tracker Spring Challenge!  
Pretend to swim like a Redband Trout, then spot three signs of spring—budding leaves, busy birds, or rippling water.
