NEIGHBORHOOD SCAVENGER HUNT

Scavenger Hunt Stop: Comstock Park

Tall trees, green grass, and a community pool offer lots of options to gather and play

Fun Fact: The flow rate of the Spokane River could fill the Comstock pool in 2.7 seconds during high flow

Activity: Comstock Park is filled with mature coniferous trees. Can you measure yourself using pine cones? Compare and count together.

Scavenger Hunt Stop: South Hill Library

Cuddle up with a good book or play in the turkey treetops play space

Fun Fact: Wild turkeys are fast, feathered, and fascinating North American birds that can run up to 25 mph and fly up to 55 mph

Activity: How many turkeys can you find in the library rafters? How many turkeys are there all together? ✨

Scavenger Hunt Stop: Rocket Market

Stop to smell the flowers or soak up some sun on the patio

Fun Fact: Rocket Market strives to offer local produce. On average fresh produce in the U.S. travels approximately 1,500 miles from farm to table.

Activity: Pretend you are an artist in the cafe...can you draw what you see? Say "Hi" to the robot sculpture outside and strike a pose like you are a statue yourself.

Scavenger Hunt Stop: High Drive Bluff

Take a walk along High Dr. and enjoy the view or hop on a trail to explore the bluff

Fun Fact: The High Drive Bluff is about 60 acres with over 20 miles of trails maintained and cared for by the community.

Activity: Wildflowers can be found all along the bluff. How many different kinds can you find? Which one is your favorite...why?

Scavenger Hunt Stop: Hazel's Creek

Waving grasses and the trickle of a creek, an example of low impact development where wildlife and people can play

Fun Fact: The historic Missoula floods filled stream channels with gravel and sand, and this created underground streams called paleochannel.

Activity: Check out the map at the entrance and explore the interpretive stations. Can you find the old apple tree and play on the branches of the big willow?

Scavenger Hunt Stop: Hamblen Park

A patch of nature with paths through the forest, arrowleaf balsam root flowers are abundant in the spring and early summer

Fun Fact: The arrowleaf balsam root plant is a vital traditional food and medicine for many Inland Northwest tribes including the Salish, Kootenai, and Nez Perce.

Activity: Take a 5 senses walk through the park. What can you see... touch...smell... hear...taste?
