NEIGHBORHOOD SCAVENGER HUNT

Scavenger Hunt Stop: Dwight Merkel Sports Complex
 Play ball! Sporty fields, a playground, and an unpaved hiking trail that leads to Riverside State Park trails and great views of the Spokane River!

Fun fact: SYSA (Spokane Youth Sports Association) serves over 12,000 participants annually in various sports.

Activity: Find an open field and play a game of red light (stop) and green light (go). Explore different ways of moving: running, hopping, skipping, marching.

Scavenger Hunt Stop: Wyakin Park Stone Labyrinth
 A path in the park of painted stones, follow along for fun and inspiration

Fun fact: Unlike mazes a true labyrinth is made with a single unbroken path that leads to the center without dead ends

Activity: Take a mindful moment in the center of the labyrinth, close your eyes and quietly count to 10. Share with each other what you were thinking about. Bonus fun –decorate your own rock to add to the labyrinth! ✨

Scavenger Hunt Stop: Joe Albi Skate Park
 Get rolling or watch along as others ride, slide, jump and grind

Fun Fact: Skateboards were invented in California in the late 1940s to early 1950s as a way to “sidewalk surf” when the ocean was flat

Activity: Play a game of listing all the ways people ride on wheels...how many can you think of?

Scavenger Hunt Stop: Indian Trail Library
 Snuggle into the basalt burrow playspace while enjoying a story with someone special!

Fun Fact: *Basalt columns in Spokane are vertical polygon shaped rock formations created -10.5 million years ago by cooling lava flows, later exposed by Ice Age floods.*

Activity: All aboard the leaf boat! Pretend you are sailing away on a great adventure...where would you go? What would you want to bring with you?

Scavenger Hunt Stop: Pacific Park
 Swing, splash, or play, it's a fun place to spend the day!

Fun Fact: The Indian Trail neighborhood's name comes from the presence of a centuries-old trail through the area

Activity: Enjoy a game of “hide-and-seek” on the playground. Count 1-10 then it's “ready or not, here I come”.

Scavenger Hunt Stop: Fire Station #17
 Community helpers that keep us safe. Enjoy the mosaic mural featuring hoses, ladders, and flames.

Fun Fact: The Spokane Fire Department was first established in 1884 as a volunteer force.

Activity: Practice playing: stop-drop-and roll. Talk about your family's plan for fire safety. Who are some of the other people in your life that help keep you safe?
